There is reason to believe that the Respondent named herein has willfully violated the Packers and Stockyards Act, 1921, as amended and supplemented (7 U.S.C. § 181 et seq.; hereinafter "Act"), and, therefore, this complaint is issued alleging the following:

I.

- (a) Warren Hudspeth (hereinafter "Respondent"), is an individual whose mailing address is P.O. Box 1089, Pilot Point, Texas 76258.
 - (b) At all times material herein, Respondent was:
 - (1) Engaged in the business of buying and selling livestock in commerce as a dealer for his own account and for the account of others; and
 - (2) Registered with the Secretary of Agriculture as a dealer to buy and sell livestock in commerce for his own account and for the account of others.

II.

(a) On or about the dates and in the transactions set forth below, Respondent issued checks in payment for livestock purchases, which checks were returned unpaid by the bank upon which they were drawn because Respondent did not have and maintain sufficient funds on deposit and available in the account upon which the checks were drawn to pay the checks when presented.

(b) Respondent, in connection with his operations subject to the Act, on or about the dates and in the transactions set forth in Appendix A and incorporated herein by reference, failed to pay the full amount of the purchase price for livestock within the time period required by the Act, with the total amount remaining unpaid of \$11,666.03 as of April 17, 2009.

III.

By reason of the facts alleged in paragraph II, Respondent has willfully violated sections 312(a) and 409 of the Act (7 U.S.C. §§ 213(a), 228b).

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that this complaint shall be served upon Respondent for the purpose of determining whether Respondent has willfully violated the Act and the Regulations. Respondent shall have twenty (20) days after receipt of this complaint in which to file an answer with the Hearing Clerk, Room 1031-South Building, United States Department of Agriculture, 1400 Independence Avenue, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20250-9200, in accordance with the Rules of Practice Governing Formal Adjudicatory Proceedings Instituted by the Secretary Under Various Statutes (7 C.F.R. § 1.130 et seq.; hereinafter "Rules of Practice"). Allegations not answered shall be deemed admitted for the purpose of this proceeding. Failure to file an answer will constitute an admission of all the material allegations of this complaint.

² Respondent still owes \$11,666.03 for this purchase as of April 17, 2009.

The Packers and Stockyards Program, Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration (GIPSA), requests:

- 1. That unless Respondent fails to file an answer within the time allowed, or files an answer admitting all the material allegations of this complaint, this proceeding be set for oral hearing in accordance with the Rules of Practice; and
- 2. That such order or orders be issued, including an order requiring Respondent to cease and desist from the violations of the Act and the Regulations found to exist, suspending Respondent as a registrant under the Act, and assessing such civil penalties against Respondent as are authorized by the Act and warranted in the circumstances.
